What is a National Professional Qualification (NPQ)?

NPQs are the most widely recognised qualification in the education sector for current and aspiring teachers and leaders. Accredited by the Department for Education (DfE), they provide training and support for teachers and leaders at all levels.

Who is eligible to do an NPQ?

You will need a Teacher Reference Number (TRN) and full support from your school/organisation. Some NPQs have specific experience requirements as detailed on our website.

What if I do not have a Teacher Reference Number (TRN) to apply for an NPQ?

If you do not have a TRN, you will need to apply for one via the DfE before you can apply for an NPQ. Visit <u>Teacher reference number (TRN) - GOV.UK</u>

What is Calderdale & Kirklees Teaching School Hub (CKTSH)?

Which NPQ is best for me?

How long does it take to complete an NPQ?

The length of time it takes to complete an NPQ depends on the type of programme you choose; our specialist programmes last 12 months and our leadership programmes last 18 months.

How will I study for an NPQ?

NPQ programmes are delivered through blended learning comprising a combination of facilitated synchronous sessions and self-study.

Each NPQ programme consist of a series of courses made up of online modules and an accompanying group clinic.

You will spend approximately 50 minutes per week studying for your NPQ. In addition, you will have a 2 hour virtual clinic and a 1 hour 15mins community session either virtually or in-person roughly each half-term.

You will be provided with a programme dates schedule at the beginning of your programme so you can plan your NPQ around your existing timetable.

It will take approximately 80/82 hours to complete a leadership NPQ.

It will take approximately 55 hours to complete a specialist NPQ.

How will I access course materials?

All materials are provided to you through the My Ambition and Steplab platforms. Login details will be provided to you upon enrolment.



How many days will I be required to spend out of school?

For specialist programmes, you will attend a full day in-person launch conference at the start of the programme and a 2 hour in-person assessment clinic towards the end of the programme. All other clinics usually take place virtually 4-6pm so outside of the school day.

For leadership programmes, you will be required to attend a full day in-person launch conference at the start of the programme, a second full day in-person conference midway through the programme and a 2 hour in-person assessment at the end of the programme.

For the NPQ Headship, you will also be required to undertake a school visit midway through the programme.

Who will deliver my chosen NPQ programme?

Our NPQ programmes are delivered by experienced and engaging teachers/educators who bring with them a wealth of knowledge of current research and best practices in education.

Can I network with other participants on the course?

When you join your NPQ programme, you will attend an in-person launch conference during which you will meet peers on your programme. You will be assigned a community group (structured, peer-led sessions focussing on solving problems) and a buddy (with whom you will complete fortnightly application modules). You will also attend a clinic every half-term where you work with your peers to apply your learning to case studies.

What is a clinic?

Clinics are 2-hour, facilitated sessions that check participant understanding of the content delivered through the modules you complete weekly on Steplab. They address common misconceptions, further contextualise the content and go through problem-solving/scenario-based approaches, so are great preparation for the assessment.

Where do I find the zoom link for my virtual NPQ clinic?

Zoom links can be found under the relevant NPQ tab within the 'Hub Library' tab of our website.

Can I do more than one NPQ at the same time?

We do not advise doing more than one NPQ programme at any one time.

Can I do an NPQ at the same time as my colleagues?

So long as you have approval from your headteacher/line manager then it is possible that more than one member of staff can do to the same NPQ at the same time.

Can I do an NPQ if I have already done one?

Yes, you can do an NPQ regardless of your previous engagement with NPQs. You cannot receive funding for the same NPQ again if you have previously withdrawn or failed the programme.



I don't have Qualified Teacher Status (QTS), can I still do an NPQ?

While NPQs are often pursued by teachers, they are also accessible to other education professionals, including support staff who may not have QTS. You will need to obtain a Teacher Reference Number (TRN) from the DfE you don't already have one.

How much does it cost to do an NPQ?

If your school/setting is eligible for funding and you are successful in securing a funded place, then there is no cost. Eligibility for DfE funding depends on the school/setting in which you work. Visit <u>Funding for national professional qualifications (NPQs) - GOV.UK</u> for further details.

If your school/setting is not eligible for funding, or there are no funded places, you can still do an NPQ but there will be a cost to you/your school. You will need approval from your headteacher/line manager that they will cover the cost of your NPQ. Alternatively, you have the option to self-fund. Please see our website <u>NPQ costs</u> for the cost of each NPQ.

How do I apply for an NPQ?

You will need your Teacher Reference Number (TRN) and will need to apply via our lead provider, Ambition Institute, and the Department for Education (DfE). Please visit our <u>website</u> or contact the Hub for details of our next cohort.

When will I hear if I have been accepted onto an NPQ programme?

Applications are assessed by the Hub as they are received. We aim to provide an initial response to all applications within 10 working days.

My email address has changed; how do I update my details?

Email the Hub at <u>cktsh@sharemat.co.uk</u> and we will update our records. The Hub will also inform Ambition Institute to do the same.

I have moved schools; how do I update my details?

Please check that your new school supports you doing the NPQ, then email the Hub at <u>cktsh@sharemat.co.uk</u> with your new school name and email address and we will update our records. The Hub will also inform Ambition Institute to do to the same.

Why am I not receiving emails from the Hub or Ambition Institute?

You are required to regularly check your inbox, including junk and spam folders for emails from the Hub and Ambition Institute. We ask that you add the following email addresses to your safe sender list; @salesforce.com / @ambition.org.uk / @steplab.co.uk / @steplab.co / @sharemat.co.uk to ensure you don't miss important emails.

I am moving out of area, can I continue with my NPQ?

You are welcome to continue with your NPQ with CKTSH so long as you seek prior approval from your new headteacher/line manager.



I need to defer my place; how do I do this?

You are permitted one deferral throughout the duration of NPQ programme which must be due to an extenuating circumstance. See the 'deferrals' section within the <u>NPQ Participant</u> Agreement on our website for further details.

I can no longer continue doing my NPQ, what do I do?

If you are struggling to complete your NPQ, please contact the Hub <u>cktsh@sharemat.co.uk</u> so we can try support you to complete your NPQ. If you decide to withdraw from the programme, you will lose the right to funding for that NPQ programme with all providers and will be unable to reapply for that NPQ course again unless you self-fund. You can still apply for funding for a different NPQ.

How will I be assessed?

On completion of at least 90% of the programme, you will enter the 8-day assessment window at the end of your NPQ programme. This is an open-book style assessment where you will be provided with a case study and three questions. The assessment windows are set by the DfE and cannot be altered.

When will I get my NPQ assessment result?

You will receive a pass or fail approximately 3 months after you have submitted your assessment. The Hub will email you with details on how to access your result.

What happens if I fail my NPQ assessment?

You have two attempts to pass the assessment. If you fail the first time, the Hub will provide details of the next assessment window which will contain a new case study. If you fail your assessment on two occasions, then will be no further opportunities to sit the assessment.

How do I access my NPQ certificate?

If you have passed your assessment, your certificate will be available to view and download through the Teacher Self-Service portal (<u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/teacher-self-service-portal</u>) approximately 4-6 weeks after you have received your pass result. You will need to know your Teacher Reference Number (TRN) to gain access to your qualification. If you do not know your TRN or have difficulties accessing Teacher Self-Service, then you should contact the Teaching Regulation Agency on 0207 593 5394 or at <u>qts.enquiries@education.gov.uk</u>.

I have successfully completed my NPQ, what next?

Congratulations on completing your NPQ, a great achievement!

The number of teachers completing a second NPQ has increased. You may wish to deepen your knowledge in a particular area by undertaking one of our specialist NPQs. Alternatively, you may be looking to develop your leadership skills or progress to a leadership role in which case, one of our leadership programmes may be the best route.
